



4. Under the agenda of implementing the CCFUP of the University of Burdwan, starting from the 2023-24 academic session, it is resolved that:

Within the buckets of multidisciplinary courses the college will offer computer science to all BA 4 years students, environment science to all BA 3 years students and English communication to all B.Sc. 4 years and 3 years students as a part of multi disciplinary approach to adopt CCFUP. Moreover, it is decided that the college will offer compulsory minor courses to all UG students on vocational educational training within the ambit of university stipulation which primarily focuses on human resource management, medical sells



management and retail sells associate. Moreover, the departments will prepare lesson plans, model question banks for the students so that they can easily adopt those courses easily.

- Faculty enrichment and orientation is done in college on NEP 2020 and CCFUP on 14.03.2023 and 04.04.2023.
- CCFUP structure was covered in detail through Student induction 2023, a five day long programme where sensitization of students was done on NEP 2020 & CCFUP.
- Course content and lesson plan of the entire UG programme offered by this college in line to CCFUP structure for Semester-I is updated in the college website.
- It is further resolved to offer value added course on "Health and fitness, yoga education, sports and fitness" in second semester for each UG students under CCFUP programme among several options stipulated by the BU as part of life skill development and promotion of IKS.
- It is further resolved that the college will continue preparing a database of ABC IDs in NAD Digi-locker for paperless governance and curtailing verification process.

Under matter arising section it is reported that the Academic Audit Committee, The University of Burdwan have consented to conduct an academic audit on 19.09.2023 for the session 2022-23. As per our existing framework, Dr. Bidyut Kumar Das, Dr Rakhi Bhattacharyay, Dr. Parnajyoti Karmakar will primarily face the audit team. It is also reported that the Administrative Audit will be held on 08.09.2023 and the same team will primarily face the audit team. All departments and office staff are advised to prepare all documents related to the academic audit and administrative audit to present to the audit teams.

It is reported that Gender Audit, Energy Audit and Green/Environment Audit successfully held for the session 2022-2023. It is resolved that the college will apply for Quality Audits under ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 14001:2015 Certification. Dr. Tanmay Das, Assistant Professor of Physics is entrusted to prepare documentation for Stage – I and II Quality Audits for ISO 9001:2015 and Stage – I and II Environment Audit for ISO 14001:2015.

Under this section external members have suggested a few issues to be addressed which are appended below:

i) During the SSR preparation results of the academic session 2022-23 are to be included in the list under Criterion 2.



- ii) Student feedback analysis and subsequent action taken are to be prepared academi session wise under criterion 1.
- iii) The college will be more proactive for disseminating information regarding employability opportunities of students and may conduct workshops on biodata writing mock interview etc.
- iv) The faculties are proactive to publish research papers in Scopus and UGC-CARE listed journals.
- v) The NSS camps are to be hold at least twice a year. The college may conduct seminar and workshops on cyber security and cyber fraud and may contact with district police head quarter for the conduction of same.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to the chair.



Quality management


- Documentation and Geo-tagged photography of all co-curricular and extra curricular activity.

Academic Enrichment


- Preparation of academic calendar of 2022- 2023

- → We have created a Central computing lab for our students and faculties and 18 PCs are already installed with proper LAN connectivity. Moreover, we have submitted a proposal to the H.E. Deptt. through GeM for additional 10 PCs and that has been lying with the H.E. Deptt. till date.

- Installation of 5 KWP off-grid solar inverter for uninterrupted power supply.
- → We have communicated with the PWD, Electrical, Burdwan Division for such works and they informed us verbally that the tendering process is underway.




- Installation of 3 FTTH connection through Bharat Air Fiber with Wi-Fi facility within the academic complex.

- → We are able to purchase to one UV/Vis Spectrophotometer for the Dept. of Chemistry amounting Rs. 4,35,750/-. Additionally, we have procured Instrument/Equipment for the Department of Physics amounting to Rs. 97,708/- during this session.





- 3. As per the instruction of the HE Deptt, the college is bound to submit IIQA by April, 2024 which restrict the institute to showcase the assessment period from 2018-19 to 2022-2023.

The house unanimously decided to collect the data for the session 2018-2019 from the respective faculties including the HoI who have been transferred from this institution at that time in terms of their academic credentials, research activities etc. The house requested the coordinator to prepare the criterion wise and key indicator wise questionnaires from the latest from of SSR available in the NAAC portal and marking of quantitative questionnaire complying the SOP of NAAC. The house requested the HoI to coordinate with AG. West Bengal for conduction of financial audit. The house entrusted Dr. Mani Shankar Mondal and Dr. Parnajyoti Karmakar to prepare financial documents from 2018-19 to 2022-23 for its audit through government register auditor before submission of NAAC SSR, if AG, West Bengal fails to conduct audit before NAAC assessment.

The external member Sri Prasun Ranjan Bhowmik, TO, Kalna Treasury, agreed to assist the institute for financial document preparation as the college doesn't have any permanent accountant since its inception.

The external member Dr. Anindya Jyoti Pal, CoE, BU suggested to collect documents related to indexing in UGC CARE, SCOPUS, SCI etc against each publications that the college wants showcase in its NAAC-SSR.

It is reported the college has successfully obtained the ISO certification in quality and environment management which will benefit the institute in NAAC-SSR preparation. Sri Manik Kisku is entrusted to contact with the competent authority of various scholarship schemes to authenticate the scholarship data of our college through their office. Dr. Mahatsab Mandal is entrusted to contact with the BU to authenticate the student enrollment date and final year result data from the session 2018-19 to 2022-23 for it's onwards submission to NAAC-SSR. The house unanimously proposed to conduct a review meeting in the month of May'24 to assess the preparedness of the institute for submission of NAAC-SSR. The house decided to apply for financial approval from the HE Deptt. for NAAC assessment fees amounting to Rs. 5.01,500/-. The house finally resolved to submit the IIQA latest by the month of April'24 by preparing skeleton data of the institutional academic and administrative activities.

The IQAC coordinator reported that the college has already collected the course end survey and students' feedback on faculty for the odd semesters 2023-24 and the analysis was made based on those documents the other feedbacks on even semester, faculty, parent and alumni will be collected in due course and it is resolved that the final analysis of all feedbacks must be reported to the IQAC for preparation of proposed activities for the session 2024-25 and this report must be included in the academic audit of 2023-24.
